**Thoughts on Our Memory Verse**

Lamentations 3:22-23 –  
*The steadfast love of  
the Lord never ceases;  
his mercies never come to an end;  
they are new every morning;  
great is your faithfulness.*



These poetic lines seem like they would reflect an abundant and joyful time, but they occur in the middle of a litany of ... well, laments. Israel is experiencing God's judgment of their sin and rebellion. Jerusalem, including the temple, has been destroyed and the people have been dragged off to captivity in Babylon. After 2 ½ chapters of listing some pretty graphic woes, the author (presumed to be Jeremiah) expresses his utter brokenness. He then does a 180 in verse 21:

*But this I call to mind,  
and therefore I have hope:*

The KJV and NIV translate the beginning of verse 22 to say that it is because of the Lord's mercies/love that "we are not consumed."

The context makes the memory verses even more meaningful. Despite what is going on around us or what we are experiencing, we have hope, because we have a God of love and mercy and faithfulness Who upholds, sustains, and preserves us.

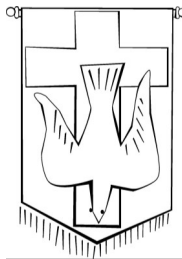

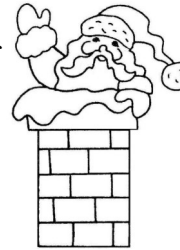
