Thoughts on Our Memory Verse

"Fear not, little flock, for it is your Father's good pleasure to give you the kingdom." Luke 12:32

A good way to introduce this verse is simply to read Luke 12:22-31. Seriously, read it; I'll wait...

Okay, so now we know why we do not have to worry. God knows what we need, and he will provide for our physical lives. Verse 32 tops that; Jesus says we don't need to be afraid for our spiritual lives either. God wants everyone to be saved. He knew we needed a Savior, and he provided Jesus. God is very happy to give us the kingdom. Emphasis on "give."

By his grace (God's Riches At Christ's Expense) through the gift of faith in his Son's sacrifice, we are assured of our place in the kingdom of heaven after we die.

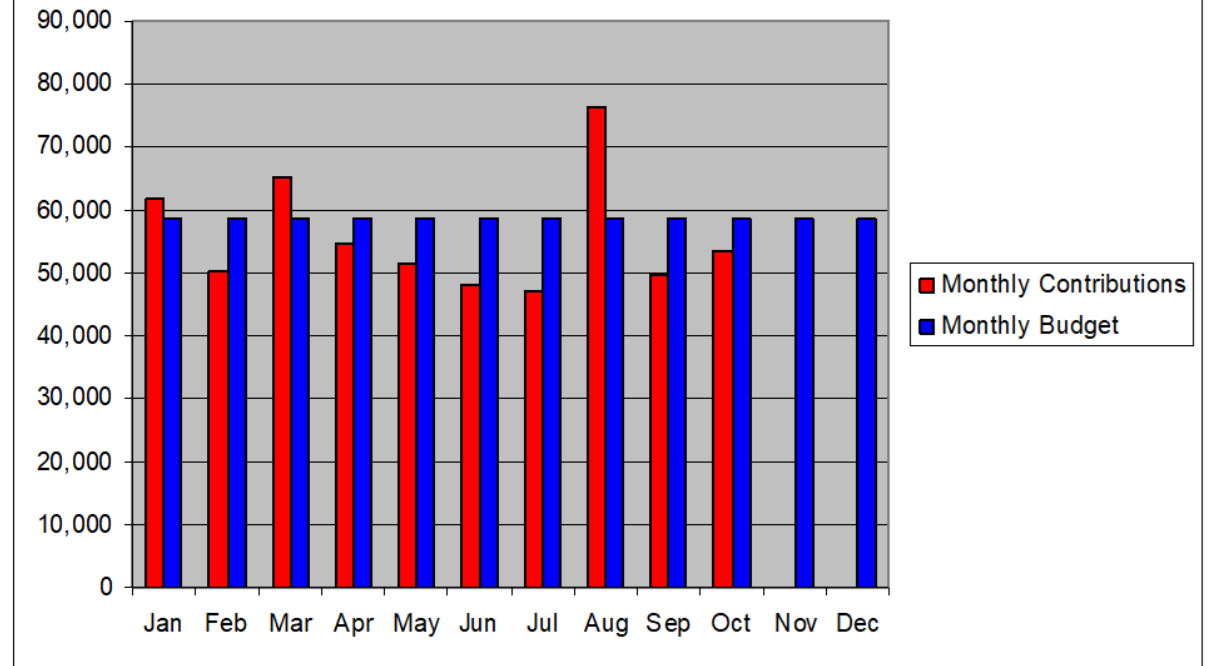
STEWARDSHIP
