Thoughts on Our Memory Verse

“This, the first of his signs, Jesus did at Cana in Galilee, and manifested his glory. And his disciples believed in him.” (John 2:11)



"Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of the disciples, which are not written in this book; but these are written so that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in his name." John 20:30-31

John's Gospel records only 7 miraculous signs in his account. There's an obvious reason for this. He writes his account not to convince us that Jesus is who He is based on signs and miracles that cause wonder and awe. We're convinced that Jesus is who He is based off of what John writes about Him: *"And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we have seen his glory, glory as of the only Son from the Father, full of grace and truth."* John 1:14

People today continue to search for God through signs and miracles, convincing us of the reality of God and who He is. However, we're convinced that God in the flesh, Jesus Christ, is exactly who He is: the Word of God who takes on flesh to dwell with us!

God comes to dwell with us every time we gather for worship. It is there He gives to us the miraculous sign of His manifested glory found in forgiveness and life through Word and Sacrament! These are given to you that you might believe that Jesus is the Christ, our God revealed to us!
