Are you 72 years old? If you are, and you have a regular Individual Retirement Account (IRA), you need to take a Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) before the end of the year. You have a great opportunity to give a “Qualified Charitable Distribution” (QCD) before paying taxes on this distribution. Just ask the institution where you have your regular IRA invested to make the check payable to the charities of your choice, e.g. Trinity Lutheran or Faribault Lutheran School.

Making a QCD withdrawal from your IRA is a wonderful way to support your church and school without having the required distribution added to your income for that year. Remember, however, to report these QCD’s to your tax preparer. If you are 70 1/2 you do not have a required minimum distribution, but you are still eligible to make a tax free QCD.

Thanksgiving Pie Orders: Trinity Pie Makers will offer pies for sale for Thanksgiving. The pies will be frozen and unbaked.



Order forms are available at the Information Center at church. Please fill out the form and place it in the box that is provided or call Jackie Denninger at 507-339-0920. The final day for ordering pies for Thanksgiving will be November 7. The pies you ordered will be ready to be picked up on Monday, November 21, 9am-1pm, and Tuesday, November 22, 12-6pm. The price for the pies is \$10.

Even though the pies will be frozen and unbaked, each pie comes with directions for baking. Please note that pumpkin and pecan pies ARE baked and then frozen. These pies just need to be defrosted.

We appreciate your continued support for our pie project.
