Ask your questions; don't be afraid to raise the issue you have on your heart. The Lord will use the mix of prayer and discussion to surface the leader you choose.

My prayers will be with you as you gather on the evening of the 30th in Church.

In the weeks ahead we will complete our walk together to the end of the Epiphany season on the mountain of Transfiguration. I pray that your vision of the resplendent glory on the mountain will radiate the warmth of hope in your fellowship.

e may all feel among ourselves a small amount of disappointment and depression these days about our pastor situation. In the years after Pr. Kuehne retired, we went through a series of temporary pastors that never seemed to end. Now, since Pr. Rieger left, it seems we are $oldsymbol{\perp}$ getting back in this long searching mode again with no one taking AT WORK the Call. I have heard people mumble that there is something wrong with Trinity; something that bothers potential pastors.

I am here to tell you that this is wrong. We have a very active and loving church culture here that God has created, blessed and continues to bless. The atmosphere we have here at Trinity is actually admired by other pastors.

The other day I heard a story about how a church can not only be a blessing to its own people and others in its area but can also even affect the life and faith of its own pastor.

It seems that a certain church had some of the same problems as us, where they had a string of temporary pastors. One of these temporary pastors was going through a personal crisis where he doubted his own capabilities as a pastor and even doubted if God was still with him and supporting him in his work. does. Needless to say, he continued on as a pastor and went on to another church where I'm sure he is doing well.

I heard another story also from a former pastor here. His sister had visited him from out of town and visited Trinity for the first time. She told him afterward that Trinity was one of the friendliest churches she had ever visited (btw, most of our people here didn't know she was the pastor's sister). I have heard some people say that years ago, Trinity had seemed a little cool and perhaps aloof toward visitors. Well, if that was true then, it certainly isn't true now.

We have a lot going for us here at Trinity. God is here in all ways with us and it shows, in our love toward one another and in the many activities we have that support and positively affect our own people and those all around us. Don't worry about who God ultimately brings here to be our pastor; it will be the one He has planned for all along to be ours.

ent, the church-year season that begins on Ash Wednesday, is a time of penitence and spiritual renewal. Some people give up a luxury or vice during Lent as a form of self-denial; others undertake a project that benefits others.

The point isn't to denigrate ourselves or to see how much we can do without. Instead, Lent helps us reflect on Jesus' death. As Timothy Keller writes in *The Reason for God:* "The Christian Gospel is that I am so flawed that Jesus had to die for me, yet I am so loved and valued that Jesus was glad to die for me. This leads to deep humility and deep confidence at the same time. It undermines both swaggering and sniveling. I cannot feel superior to anyone, and yet I have nothing to prove to anyone. I do not think more of myself nor less of myself. Instead, I think of myself less."

n addition to all that is happening with Sudanese ministry here in Southern Minnesota, I could also write a monthly article about all that is happening among the Lutherans in the border regions between South Sudan and Ethiopia.

The latest development is the establishment of a new diocese of the Evangelical Lutheran Church of South Sudan/Sudan (ELCSS/S) in western Ethiopia. The diocese will be based in Gambella with Pastor Peter Wichieng as its provisional leader.

1599 people attended the gathering to celebrate this new addition to the ELCSS/S. Representatives from all six of the other dioceses of the ELCSS/S in Ethiopia also attended. The Scriptural basis for the gathering was, "This is the day the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad in it." (Psalm 118:24) and, "Praise and Glory to God in the

highest heaven and on earth peace to those on whom his favor rests." (Luke 2:14)

Please pray for the members and leaders of this new diocese. As one of the leaders pointed out, "We cannot do it without you joining us. It is the time God's plan is being revealed as the saying goes, 'If God says yes, who can say no?' (2 Corinthians 1:20). God bless you all and we are blessed because of your prayers and support."



During the year, we fell steadily behind until, as I said in November's newsletter article, we would need an extra \$35,000 at the end of the year to come out even. You all tried your best, I'm sure, but we fell far short. We ended the year about \$20,000 in the red. Nobody is blaming anyone. The reasons our donations have been so much less this last year are many and varied. As I said in November, one reason is that most of us are hurting from high inflation, including myself.

Luckily, being that much in the red doesn't mean we are going broke or can't pay our bills; at least not yet. What it means is we have a smaller cushion to fall back on. Many years ago, when I first became business manager, the amount we had in our general fund was small enough that we had to pick and choose which bills to pay and
