


A sprinkle of pepper and a dab of soap illustrate a big concept from God's Word.

- Bible






- 2. Sprinkle pepper on the water.



God's Got You

n Roman 4 Paul writes: "If it is the adherents of the law who are to be the heirs, faith is null and the promise is void.

... For this reason the promise depends on faith, in order that it may rest on grace" (v. 14, 16, NRSV). Here and elsewhere, Paul firmly explains that we are saved through

God's grace, or unconditional love, made known most profoundly in Jesus Christ. But this passage raises a question: If belief (trust, faith) reckons us as righteous before God, what if we don't trust, can't believe, have lost all faith?

Pastor Martin Luther (1483-1546) assures us that even this is a gift of God: "I believe that by my own



understanding or strength I cannot believe in Jesus Christ my Lord or come to him, but instead the Holy Spirit has called me through the gospel, enlightened me with his gifts, made me holy and kept me in the true faith" (The Small Catechism; emphasis added). Later in Romans, Paul declares

that when we feel so lost (unbelieving, lacking in faith) that we don't even know how to pray, the "Spirit himself intercedes for us" (8:26, NIV). Rest assured, dear one: God's got you.



From Your Financial Manager

HOW ARE WE DOING FINANCIALLY SO FAR FOR THIS YEAR?

s we are about half way through the 2023 year, I thought I would give everyone an update on how we are doing financially so far in 2023. A graph showing our contributions, expenses and resulting deficit (health) of the General Fund is a good way to pictorially show where we are sitting. The graph here shows these factors so far in 2023 (monthly income/expenses in blue and yellow bars and the deficit as the black line) compared with the same information from last year (deficit as the grey line).



The curve for this year, 2023, follows the first half of last year very closely. Just like last year, Easter contributions were good and drove our deficit down to zero and beyond, about \$15,000 to the good. But then again, as last year, things have begun to turn around and our deficit is going back up. June figures aren't complete yet but it looks like the trend will continue, as last year, with increased deficit as the year goes on. This is because our contributions in general are lower than our expenses and of course we have summer slump to add to the problem.

If we continue to mirror the same trend as last year, we will again wind up at year's end being tens of thousands in the red. If that were to continue for several years, we would wind up again badly in debt like we were two decades ago.

Our Restricted Funds so far are holding pretty well even though we will have heavy property expenses this summer from the tunnel pipe replacement. In January, we received about \$40K in federal funds from the Employee Retention Credit program by keeping our staff employed during the Covid crisis. We have also received \$20K from an estate gift though one of our members and are hoping for another \$10K estate gift this summer. With these funds added to the restricted accounts, we should have enough for our property projects for this year.

Again, as I stated in the February Newsletter concerning last year's deficit, I don't blame any of our membership for our General Fund situation; it's largely caused by the national economic situation plus the loss of many of our older members over the past few years. I would just ask that everyone do what they can and pray for guidance in your own financial planning.

ecause many Americans have never known other circumstances, it's easy to take our liberties for granted. The Israelites knew firsthand the oppression of slavery. Yet when God finally led them out of Egypt, they had problems adjusting to their newfound freedom. Fearful and rebellious, the Israelites grumbled against their leaders, Moses and Aaron, saying they would've been better off as slaves in Egypt.

Our freedom as Christians cost Jesus His life. But we, too, often find it easier to fall back into sinful habits. In Galatians 5:1, Paul offers this encouragement: "For freedom Christ has set us free. Stand firm, therefore, and do not submit again to a yoke of slavery" (NRSV).
