



Take away my difficulties, that victory over them may bear witness to those I would help of Thy power, Thy love and Thy way of life. May I do Thy will always!







What you do:


- 1. Label the bag with details about the missionaries you'll be praying for (names, location, specific needs).

- 4. Place the bag where it will remind your family to pray regularly.




CITY SEARCH

Prayers of <u>Supplication</u> asking for what we need in our church, school, community, nation and world.


No one is required to pray aloud. Come, sit, join in heart and mind as others pray aloud. Everyone is welcome.





WHY HAVE A DOMESTIC VIOLENCE AWARENESS MONTH?

t is said that domestic violence thrives in silence. While that may sound like a powerful statement, what does it actually mean?

When someone is a victim of domestic violence, it can be incredibly isolating. You live in fear in your own home. You live in fear of your children being emotionally affected, even physically harmed. You live in fear of others finding out. This is indeed a heavy, constant burden to bear.

Now imagine if your friends, your family and society in general does not state clearly and repeatedly that domestic violence is wrong, that people don't deserve to be treated this way and that perpetrators need to be held accountable.

When there is a lack of anti-violence messaging and a lack of tangible support, victims are left to their own thoughts, to their feelings of shame and they may even think that perhaps they deserve to be treated this way.

This is why there is a Domestic Violence Awareness Month. Every October, we have the opportunity to educate people about the prevalence of domestic violence, to drive awareness of the problem and to cultivate the understanding that can result in victims obtaining the support, the resources and the courage they need to take the necessary steps that can lead them to safety.

How does an awareness month accomplish this? Maybe it's the integration of information into a sermon heard at church. Maybe it's messaging seen on a poster or in a training manual in the workplace. Maybe it's an element of a lesson plan about healthy relationships learned in school.

How important is this in our own community? HOPE Center serves 1,200-1,300 clients per year. And that's just the individuals who have the information and the opportunity needed to reach out to us. Imagine how many more victims of domestic violence are out there here in Rice County. That's how important this is.

I am very happy to report that Domestic Violence Awareness Month has led to HOPE Center being invited to do presentations to many types of organizations during the month. These include nurses, women's groups, churches and the Minnesota Corrections Association.

In addition to educating participants about the key issues related to domestic violence, these presentations also provide the opportunity to highlight the work of so many organizations that collaborate throughout our area to serve victims and to decrease incidents of violence. Attendees may even realize that they themselves may be at risk in their own relationships.

This awareness month also serves to reenergize our HOPE Center staff and volunteers as we carve out time to update ourselves on the issues, resources and advances related to combatting domestic violence. Highlighting the work of the many organizations who collaborate with us reinforces that we are not alone in our work. We review new, proven approaches with an eye toward integrating them into our stable of resources.

We take the time to focus on our experience of the year behind us and discuss moving forward into the year ahead. Since we tend to be working in crisis mode most of the time, this opportunity to pause and reflect tends to reenergize and sustain us.

Domestic Violence Awareness Month serves so many valuable purposes. I hope you will take this opportunity to seek out information to educate yourself and, if applicable, be there for someone who needs your support and assistance.



YTD FINANCIAL UPDATE

his time of year each year I like to let everyone know what our financial status is since the end of the year is coming up before long.

There are two means of financial updates I make available to the congregation showing how our General Fund is doing as the year progresses. The first, the graph below, is the most accurate because the contributions are compared to the actual expenses each month so we can see if the fund is increasing or the deficit is getting worse during the year.



Recently, I was asked to add figures to the Weekly Newsletter each week, which I am doing. But these figures each week can't be compared to expenses easily because our expenses gyrate wildly during the month because of how the various bills crop up. So the published figures are compared with the weekly <u>budget</u> instead, which can be very misleading.

In a normal year when we have pastors being paid their planned salaries and benefits, our expenses follow our budget fairly closely. But the budget is originally set up assuming we will have two pastors in place during most of the year (best case scenario) so we never risk exceeding the budget. But this year, 2023, we have not as yet been blessed by a called pastor. The cost of the temporary and

guest pastors, that have been gracious enough to help us, do not get paid benefits since they are either retired or receive benefits elsewhere. So the Weekly Newsletter figures are useful to see what the contributions are but not useful to gauge how we are doing financially.

Now, let's go back to the above, more accurate, graph which shows how we are doing which compares our income with the smoother, more reliable monthly expenses. Note that the gray trace, which is for 2022, shows our deficit peaking out at \$35K and ending at about \$20K at the end of the year as I warned everyone would happen last year. The deficit was so high in 2022 because we still had two pastors during the course of the year, Pastor Werner for one month and Pastor Rieger for seven months. (continued on page 15)

Unfortunately, the contributions didn't nearly cover the expenses we had because of our having the two pastors. Our expenses were a lot lower than the 2022 <u>budget</u> since our pastors weren't here for the entire year but we were still short of our total expenses for the year because of contributions being low.

Looking at the bold black line on the graph, it appears that our deficit is about -\$10K (10K to the good) and that is true at this point in time even though our contributions for 2023 are looking no better than last year. But we appear to look good because we had no called pastors at all during the year.

At some point in time we will be blessed with a Senior Pastor, hopefully soon. When that happens, at the rate of contributions we are currently receiving, we will become greatly in the red for the year and our deficit will likely continue to get worse as time goes on.

I'm not telling you all this to scare you; we can correct this problem. What I'm pointing out is that especially when we finally receive our own pastor(s), we are all going to have to considerably step up our giving for us to stay in the black long term. To prepare for the future time we receive our pastor, we need to increase our giving now as we approach the year's end. By doing this, we can build up a buffer that we can use to smoothly transition to our necessary increased donations when the new pastor comes. Please begin this increase right away in our last three months of the year. Please prayerfully plan this increase for the future into next year and beyond. I have no doubt that the Lord will provide us our pastor soon. He has always watched over and blessed our church and our faithful members and He will continue to do so. As He gives to us, so we must give back to Him. Please think of this as you plan ahead. Bill Kirkpatrick
