

WHAT'S YOUR NOVEMBER?



or Davey Blackburn, a pastor in Indiana, one particular month has brought "the highest of highs and the lowest of lows." He was born in November, moved to a new church in November 2011 and learned he'd be a father in November 2013. But two years later, in November 2015, Blackburn's wife and unborn second child were murdered during a home invasion.

Despite that painful tragedy, the pastor determined not to "let the enemy have a claim over November" or "steal the many beautiful memories I once held" about it. Since then, his church's worship team recorded an album one November, he proposed to his second wife another November, launched a new ministry one November and welcomed another child the following November. That journey, Blackburn says, is evidence of God's faithfulness to replace a spirit of despair with a garment of praise (see Isaiah 61:3). And it's an important reminder for the holiday season, with all its memories and traditions. Just as God wants to heal and restore, Blackburn writes, "Your [deceased] loved one would not want your 'November' to haunt your memory forever."

Blackburn, author of the forthcoming book *Nothing Is Wasted*, says everyone has a November but can choose what to do with it. Instead of letting your November haunt, you can let God use it to heal.




churches to come. Please invite your friends to this funny but moving dinner theater experience of being present at the Inn on the night of Jesus' birth.

WHAT PROPERTY IMPROVEMENTS HAVE BEEN MADE IN 2023

ven though I'm no longer Property Manager, I thought everyone may be interested in what's been happening during 2023 through the work of the new Property Manager, Dale Kelm, and the people on the Property Committee.

The largest project this year was the re-plumbing of all of the pipes in our underground tunnels. Most of these iron pipes were installed in the 1950s and have corroded during the ensuing years to the point where they were leaking and causing damage to the downstairs school library. As a part of this project, we also had to do an asbestos evaluation and abatement process, which were needed before the old pipes could be removed. All this work was done during the months of August and September. The old iron pipes were replaced with the newer technology PEX piping, a new type of plastic system. This renewal should last for many years. As a part of this, virtually all the asbestos in the building was removed and an Asbestos Management Plan was created which FLS needs as a part of their accreditation process. The school repaired the damage to the library which was paid for by a parental gift. So our tunnel and water distribution system should be good for many years to come and asbestos should no longer be a worry.



The cost of the above cited projects was covered by money received from the federal Employee Retention rebate program, several large estate gifts and individual donations made to the restricted property funds.

Other property improvements done so far this year include:

- Various roof leak repairs occurring over all the buildings during the year.
- Narthex, Fellowship Hall and hallway carpets cleaned (paid for by Pie Makers).
- Several A/C system and freezer repairs needed throughout buildings.
- We are adding additional high resolution security cameras to the outside of the church.
- Both rental houses painted and soffits repaired.
- Replaced one of the garbage disposals in church kitchen
- Failing church kitchen water heater was replaced.
- Replaced sanctuary thermostat covers.
- Replaced counter top in 2nd grade classroom and painted classroom trim.
- Repairs done on the lawn sprinkler system.
- Mechanical bell in the bell tower repaired.
- West narthex door's locking systems repaired.
- Replaced exit bars and locks on 4th Street silver doors and are adding weather stripping.

Thanks to Dale Kelm and the Property Committee which has many new enthusiastic members and our outside lawn and flower care people, we are keeping up with all our property issues. We are so blessed to have these volunteers willing to give their time to keep our properties looking good.


