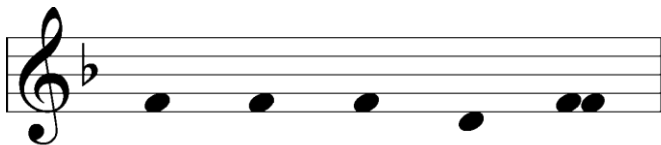
PRAYER FOR GRACE

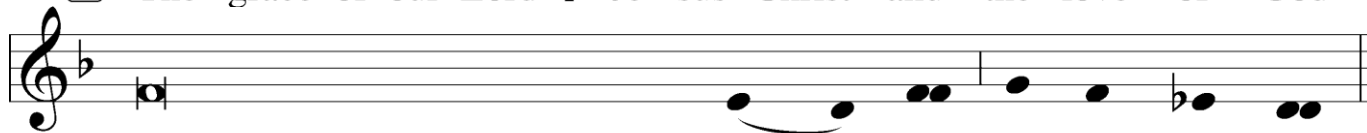
