## OUR GOD OF HOPE

ear the end of a long bout with cancer, Washington Post columnist Michael Gerson realized that hope for recovery wasn't credible. The year before he died, he wrote a Christmas message from "the antiseptic wonderland of the holiday hospital ward," asking, "What sustains hope when there is scant reason for it?"

The answer, Gerson said, is found in our "God of hope," who became vulnerable, "cloaked in blood and bone and destined for human suffering." Rather than fulfill our deepest earthly wishes, God offers eternal security: "He promises a transformation of the heart in which we release the burden of our

desires, and live in expectation of God's unfolding purposes, until all His mercies stand revealed."


That hope-filled message echoes Gerson's 2012 Christmas column, written in the aftermath of the Sandy Hook shooting. "The point of Christmas is not a sentimental optimism about the human condition or even a teaching about the will of God," he wrote. "It is an assertion that God came to our rescue, and holds our hand, and becomes, at the worst moments, our brokenhearted brother. It is preposterous, unless it is true. And then it would be everything."



However, it really isn't. Xmas has ancient origins. The letter X in Greek — the original language of the New Testament — is the first letter of the word Xristos, which translated into English is the word Christ.

So X is simply an abbreviation for the word Christ. And the letters mas are an abbreviation of the word mass. Therefore, Xmas really means Christ mass or Christ worship.



    Try building a 2 D.



# UPDATE ON INVESTIGATING THE POSSIBILITY OF COMBINING TRINITY, PEACE, FLS & PEACE PRESCHOOL

he following resolution was passed by both Trinity and Peace congregations in June. Following that meeting a committee was formed of leaders from both congregations to create mission and vision statements. Those statements were also approved by both congregations



at October and November meetings. Copies of those statements and interview summaries are available at the information center in the Narthex.

The next step will be, over the coming months, to form committees to look at logistics of such a merger.

## To Officially Begin to Investigate Becoming One Congregation with One School and One Licensed Childcare Center in Faribault Minnesota.

- 1. Whereas, The call of our Lord Jesus Christ in Matthew 28:19-20 is to go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you; and
- 2. Whereas, There was a time when two congregations in the community of Faribault were needed to best carryout the call of Jesus to make disciples; and
- 3. Whereas, Peace and Trinity made the decision to join their schools together and operate an association school for the sake of maintaining an effective school ministry; and
- 4. Whereas, The financial cost and human effort to maintain our current institutions of Peace, Trinity, FLS and Peace childcare center has not decreased at the same rate as the amount of people that are being served by these institutions, and
- 5. Whereas, It was considered wise in the past to separate for the sake of the mission of making disciples, it is also wise to consider joining back together into one congregation, one school and one child care center for the sake of the mission of Christ of making disciples; and
- 6. Whereas, On May 1, 2023 at the joint meeting of the two congregations in an unofficial and nonbinding poll of the group who was present answered 115 yes, 11 maybe or undecided, and 6 no to the question of considering joining the two congregations, school and child care center into one entity, and
- 7. Whereas, Leaders from both congregations who are named here, James Boldt, Barb Beatty, Jeffrey Blume, Deb Malmanger, Mitch Miller, Steve Mullennex, Penny Reichert, Edward Westad, Scott Arendt, Matthew Drevlow, Robert Jasmer, Dean Wegner, Jeremy Banks have met together and agreed that it is a wise plan to investigate moving forward with combining Peace Lutheran Church and Trinity Lutheran Church and Faribault Lutheran School and Peace Lutheran Child Care center into one church and school and one licensed child care center, therefore be it

1. Resolved, That the congregations of Peace Lutheran Church and Trinity Lutheran Church officially begin to investigate options of becoming one church and school and one licensed childcare center; and be it further

- 2. Resolved, That a committee made up of both Peace and Trinity members along with all called pastors of both congregations, FLS administrator, Peace Lutheran child care center director join together to formulate a purposed mission and vision statement for the purposed single congregation and school and licensed child care center; and be it further
- 3. Resolved, That this mission and vision statement is presented to both Peace and Trinity voter assemblies by no later than November 13, 2023 to be voted on as an agreed upon mission and vision for the future purposed single congregation, school, and childcare center; and be it further
- 4. Resolved, That upon passage of the mission and vision statement of the proposed single ministry of one congregation, school and licensed child care center, that a committee made up of both Peace and Trinity members along with all called pastors of both congregations, FLS administrator, Peace Lutheran child care center director would investigate and formulate a plan of action on becoming one congregation and school and one license child care center in order to carry out the mission and vison which had been previous approved by both congregations; and be it further
- 5. Resolved, That the proposed plan is presented to the congregations in a joint meeting no later than 18 months after the mission and vision had been approved by both Peace and Trinity Lutheran churches; and be it
- 6. Resolved, That both congregations in congregational voter assembly meetings are presented with the plan that seeks to carry out the agreed upon mission and vision of a new single congregation, school and child care center to be voted upon Peace and Trinity, and be it finally
- 7. Resolved, upon passage of the proposed plan the congregations would begin to take the appropriate steps to begin to implement the plan.

## THE MEASURE OF OUR GENEROSITY

f you open up the Small Catechism, you'll find a shortened version of the Third Commandment: "Remember the Sabbath day by keeping it holy." But if you look up the list of the Ten Commandments in Exodus, you'll find the full version:


Remember the Sabbath day, to keep it holy. Six days you shall labor, and do all your work, but the seventh day is a Sabbath to the LORD your God. On it you shall not do any work, you, or your son, or your daughter, your male servant, or your female servant, or your livestock, or the sojourner who is within your gates. For in six days the LORD made heaven and earth, the sea, and all that is in them, and rested on the seventh day. Therefore the LORD blessed the Sabbath day and made it holy. (Ex. 20:8–11)

Why did Luther shorten this commandment for the Small Catechism? Was it so that the kids wouldn't have so much to memorize? No, it was because Luther knew that all the details of the Third Commandment were part of the "shadow" of the Old Testament (Col. 2:16). Or as St. Paul puts it, there is "letter" in the Old Testament law and "spirit" (2 Cor. 3:6). The details of not working on Saturday were fulfilled by Christ. That part of the Sabbath regulation no longer applies. But the spirit of the law does remain: We need to dedicate sufficient time each week to hearing God's Word and giving it honor and respect. Or as Luther sums it up in the Small Catechism's explanation to the Third Commandment: "We should fear and love God so that we do not despise preaching and His Word but hold it sacred and gladly hear and learn it."

The same sort of analysis applies to our giving. In the Old Testament, God commanded the Israelites to give a tenth of their income to the Levites so that those men could dedicate their lives to serving in God's house, teaching the people, conducting worship, etc. In the New Testament, there is a rigid requirement listed about handing in your tax forms to church to make sure you've given enough. But the mandate to have a full-time ministry, which is the spirit of that law concerning tithing to the Levites, is right there in 1 Corinthians 9:14: "The Lord has ordained that those who preach the Gospel should make their living from the Gospel."

The New Testament church's job is significantly larger than the job of Old Testament Israel. We are commanded to preach the Gospel to all nations. There was only the temple to maintain in the Old Testament, but we have churches, schools, universities and seminaries, plus missionaries everywhere. So you tell me: Can we really undertake the work of the ministry if our giving doesn't even measure up to Old Testament levels of generosity?


