came in early today - Ash Wednesday - to write an encouraging note to you. I drove into Faribault with a small U-Haul trailer behind my pickup truck on January 31. With the help of a few men from Trinity, I was able to carry a few personal items into my apartment. Their help was greatly appreciated.



2024 VBS, Scuba, is being planned for August 4-8. Preparations are beginning for this exciting event! Contact Nancy Simonson if you wish to help.




Try this chilly new take on a healthy snack.

- 5. Freeze for two more hours. Enjoy!



#### SERVING OTHERS THROUGH TRINITY'S HUMAN CARE TEAM


e were blessed to hear how we can serve and love God by serving and loving others in Pastor Gueldner's Epiphany sermons.

Trinity has had a long tradition of service to others in Faribault. Human Care (originally called the Board of Social Ministry) coordinates service and fundraising projects to help those in need—both Trinity members and, also, those in our community. Examples of recent activities include: hosting Red Cross Blood Drives, collecting items

for St. Vincent's Food Shelf, organizing bell-ringers for the Salvation Army Red Kettle campaign, delivering Meals on Wheels, serving a senior luncheon several times a year, sending cards to seniors and shuts-ins, and providing transportation to medical appointments.

We also raise money to offer financial assistance, paying part of the expenses for housing, medical bills and transportation. Recipients must meet criteria and all monies are paid to the provider.

But the team doesn't do all the work. We often ask for volunteers to help with these projects. Trinity mem-

#### MINNESOTA FOODSHARE MONTH





#### GRAPH SUMMARY OF 2023 DONATIONS AND WHAT TO EXPECT FOR 2024

he graph below may seem a little "busy" but if you study it, it gives a lot of information. It covers the twelve months of 2023 and the first month of 2024.


The green bars are the monthly contributions to the General Fund. The yellow bars are the expenses for that month. The red bars are the budget for that month. For 2023, the budget numbers are somewhat irrelevant because we only had temporary pastors not being paid full salaries and benefits. What counts in 2023 are the green and yellow bars. They show the comparison each month of our giving vs. what we needed to not create a deficit. During Easter and Christmas and a few other months, we received contributions that exceeded our expense needs so we wound up well in the black for the year.

But starting now in February of 2024, because we now have a full-time interim pastor, our expenses will be about the same as the red budget bar.

So starting now, our green bar will have to be as high as the red bars. That will be about a 20% increase over last year's giving, which is about the same amount as when Pastor Rieger was still here. That may be tough for many of us to go back to, but on the other hand, we now have a gifted pastor that for at least a year and a half will give us full pastor's benefits such as preaching, teaching, counseling, office hours and all the other God-given blessings that we have been short on for almost two years now.

It's wonderful that we are getting back to normal again in our church. Please let our financial support continue to be as it needs to be also.

#### RESURRECTION RUMBLINGS

n Easter Earthquake, James A. Harnish explores the "earthshaking promise" of Jesus' resurrection. Easter Sunday "shatters the power of fear," he writes. "Because Christ is risen, we no longer allow fear to dominate, control or manipulate us. We



don't remain imprisoned in the tombs of our past failures or buried under the weight of present anxiety. In the risen Christ, old things pass away and everything becomes new."

Easter, Harnish adds, is proof that God hasn't forsaken us and is present among us. "The Resurrection contradicts the assumption that Christ resides on an ethereal cloud in a distant heaven. Rather, we find him on the dusty road that leads to the real stuff of our ordinary world."

Jesus' followers can find him everywhere, Harnish concludes. "The risen Christ will meet us along the confused, chaotic, fearful paths of our lives and speak the same words the women hear at the tomb, 'Do not be afraid.'"
