FROM OUR PASTOR Pastor Gueldner

he weather in Minnesota this year has been somewhat strange and out of character. Those who enjoy winter sports and others who make their living off of snowfall, have been disappointed. Things seem so topsy-turvy.

Many of us, including the gardeners, had resolved that winter was over and we started to embrace spring on March 19th. God had a different answer. As I write this message to you, snowflakes were coming down outside the church office on March 21st. Life has been so topsy-turvy this year.

One thing I know and cherish is that God's plan of salvation is unchanging throughout the generations of man. The time of Holy Week may change each year but the message that is presented to us is timeless.

I often wonder how you and I would have reacted to the death of Jesus if you and I lived in the first century instead of the 21^{st} century. You and I get to look back in time and marvel at the events that unfolded. I often wonder at the emotions surrounding the disciples of Jesus.

Jesus and His followers are coming down from Bethphage singing praises to the Son of David. The emotions are in high gear. For, they were proclaiming Him as the Messiah. The man-made expectations of triumph over the physical enemies of Israel were strong.

We, too, sing our praises to the Son of David our Savior on Palm Sunday, but we reserve our greatest praise until Easter. Unbeknownst to the disciples and followers of Jesus their emotions would be turned upside down as our weather has been this year.

Holy Week is a time of year for us to be reminded of all that Christ went through as our Messiah. Holy Week reminds us of the great sufferings of Jesus and the emotions and actions of the disciples during that same week.

I can't imagine the emotional rollercoaster that the disciples experienced in that week. The first day of the week was an emotional high celebrating this joyous entry parade. On Thursday evening things changed drastically after the institution of the Lord's Supper. Right before their very eyes, Jesus was arrested, later tried, and convicted to death. They hit bottom; on Friday evening, Jesus the Messiah was dead. What now?

God, who was ever in charge, provided the answer three days later. The women had gone out to the grave of Jesus expecting their final funeral preparations. The disciples were in emotional turmoil, scared of the Jewish leadership. When news came that Jesus arose from the grave, it was hard to believe. Despite an unexpected snowfall in Minnesota recently, the crocus flower of spring reminds us that new life is coming. The resurrection of Jesus from the grave on Easter morning is even greater. By Grace God brings us new life through Christ.

Come walk through the scriptures again this year. Feel the intense emotions of the first century followers of Jesus. Never forget that when Jesus died on the Cross of Calvary, His sacrifice was for you too.

On Easter morning we share those familiar words given to us by the angels, "He has arisen." By faith in Jesus as your Messiah, your sins have been forgiven. One day that will all be revealed to you with eternal life. Your emotions should run high for Christ Jesus our Lord has opened the way to heaven for us. Come celebrate the beginning of your new life in Him. Amen. $\sim Pastor\ Gueldner$

PRESSED

ethsemane, the name of the place where Jesus prayed before His betrayal, is an Aramaic word for "olive press." During Bible times, olives were pressed three times to



remove all the valuable oil. Before being arrested in the Garden of Gethsemane, Jesus felt the full pressing weight of our sins on His shoulders. Surrounded by olive trees, praying fervently while sweating drops of blood, the perfect Son of God asked His heavenly Father three times to remove the cup of suffering.

Instead of removing that trial, God used it to redeem and save humankind. Likewise, God uses our hardships to refine and strengthen our faith.

"All of us must be vigilant to watch and pray so that we don't succumb to the temptation to deny the Lord when we go through the olive presses of life and feel like we are being crushed by our situation and circumstances," the authors write. "We must remember that it is the crushing that brings out the true inner value and worth of the olive."

Use scrap paper to fuel new growth and make a gift that keeps on giving.

What you need:

- Scrap paper
- Water
- Herb or flower seeds
- Blender
- Strainer
- Cookie sheet
- Towel
- Adult help



What you do:


- Tear the scrap paper into strips and place in a bowl. Cover the paper with water and let it soak overnight.
- 2. Pour the mixture into a blender and blend about 10 seconds.
- Strain and squeeze the paper pulp to remove excess water. Place in a bowl.
- 4. Sprinkle seeds over the pulp and mix to incorporate them into the pulp.
- Shape the pulp into a flat layer on the cookie sheet. Use a towel to soak up excess water. Allow the paper to dry completely.
- 6. Tear paper into shapes or fold into a card. You can plant the paper directly into soil. Water it and then watch your plants grow!



HAVE YOU HEARD OF THE LUTHER HOUSE?

n 2009 the congregation of Trinity Lutheran Church, Rochester, felt led by the Holy Spirit to assist their out-of-town brothers and sisters in Christ who were receiving medical care away from home. Primarily a ministry to members of the LCMS in good standing, the Luther House offers housing to families staying in Rochester while undergoing medical care. The units are offered free of charge, but donations from those who are able are gratefully accepted.


The Luther House first began in 2009 as one apartment behind Trinity. In 2014, they added a second apartment. The apartments were in a complex that needed to be demolished, so they moved the ministry to their former parsonage in 2022. They held a fund drive in 2022 to cover the cost of renovating the parsonage into the three units that they have today - Luther's Rose Room, Faith Suite and Grace Family Suite. It was then that the ministry, formerly called TLCare Ministry, was renamed Luther House.

Since July of 2022, Luther House has booked more than 200 reservations with more than 1,000 "unit nights." A unit night is accommodation that would have otherwise been made at a hotel. Free parking is also available on the Luther House grounds.

The Meintsma family was able to stay at the Lutheran House during Vern's surgery in February. Vern shared that the Luther House was very home-like, quiet, clean, and well-maintained. Everything they needed was there — bedding, towels, kitchen supplies, even Wi-Fi and basic cable. It was a true blessing for the Meintsma family to be able to stay in the beautiful unit for the 15 days Vern was in Rochester.

This year, Trinity, Rochester, is holding a second fund drive. The parsonage exterior is in need of tuck-pointing and repair. If you would like to help support this wonderful ministry to LCMS families undergoing medical treatment in Rochester, please consider sending a donation to the Luther House. WHAT WE AT TRINITY DO FOR MISSIONS



ne of the major functions of a healthy church is outreach as proclaimed by Christ in the Gospel as the Great Commission: "Go therefore and teach all nations". There are several ways churches do this, including community service and outreach, supporting our LCMS Synod, both nationally and at the District level, and supporting specific missions and groups of our own choosing.

The National (actually world-wide) Synod centered in St. Louis supports such things as LCMS missions, our seminaries, Christian literature and broadcasts, our LCMS pastors and teachers and a myriad of other things of great importance to us.

The Minnesota South District office in Burnsville supports our local area of the state covering such things as local church support (coordinating pastor and teacher callings and congregational internal issues), mission work in our area and other functions. Each year, we give \$59,000 or about 8.0% of all General Fund contributions to the National and District Synods.

But here at Trinity we also allocate money each year for missions of our own choosing. \$6,500 each year is sent out to a number of organizations and missionaries that are chosen twice per year by our Mission Committee. During the year, we receive hundreds of letters from organizations all over the world describing the ways they help others and how they would use our donations. The organizations we donate to must be either LCMS missionaries (usually in foreign countries) or missions that help people around the world (preferably Christians) with food, medical care or some kind of personal or spiritual support.

In this article I am listing the organizations chosen in 2023 that were given donations.


I am taking are: Creeds and Confessions, Homiletics, Pauline Epistles, and Pastor and Church in Mission.
