





Saturday, April 13 David Raymond (consultant) met at Peace Lutheran with the leaders from each congregation. He outlined two possible mergers. He gave examples of other churches that have merged around Minnesota. He showed the results of the survey and gave a list of items for the committee to consider for a merger of Peace and Trinity.

On Sunday, April 14 the consultant gave a short presentation to a joint group of 150 people from Peace and Trinity congregations.
