REDEEMING “WASTED” TIME

In *Just Like Jesus*, Max Lucado writes that the average American spends a total of six months waiting at stoplights, eight months opening junk mail, 18 months looking for items we’ve lost and five years standing in line. All the while, many of us grumble: “What a waste of time! I could be doing something much more important! *Where* are my keys?”



But Lucado suggests that we give these moments to God. Rather than whispering to ourselves, we can speak to God in prayer.

“Simple phrases such as ‘Thank you, Father,’ ‘Be sovereign in this hour, O Lord,’ ‘You are my resting place, Jesus’ can turn a commute into a pilgrimage,” he writes. “You needn’t leave your office or kneel in your kitchen. Just pray where you are. Let the kitchen become a cathedral or the classroom a chapel. Give God your whispering thoughts.”

When we do this, “the common becomes uncommon,” Lucado adds. What’s more, “wasted” time becomes valuable; boring waits become meditative; the lost — your time, if not also your keys — is redeemed.

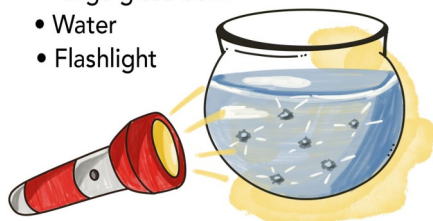

Why do stars appear to twinkle? Try this experiment to find out!

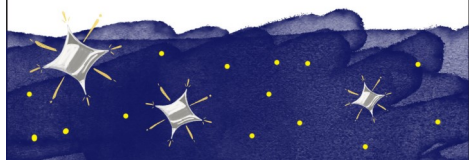
What you need:

- Aluminum foil
- Large glass bowl
- Water
- Flashlight



What you do:

1. Crumple the foil into a ball. Carefully unfold it and lay it flat on the ground.
2. Fill the bowl with water and place it on the foil.
3. Turn off the lights and make the room as dark as possible. Shine the flashlight about 1 foot from the water's undisturbed surface. Light will reflect onto the foil.
4. Then tap your finger on the water's surface. As the water moves, what happens to the light on the foil?
5. This flickering simulates scintillation, which happens when starlight enters Earth's atmosphere. As light passes through layers of gas and water, it refracts and appears to twinkle.

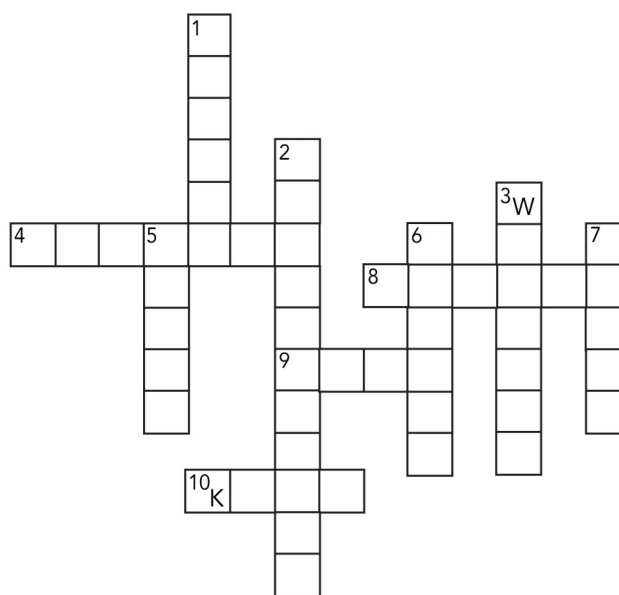

From Your Financial Manager . . .**YOU MAY HAVE WONDERED HOW WE AT TRINITY INSURE FISCAL CONFIDENCE**

We all hope that our financial people here at Trinity have integrity and honesty in all their transactions, and I think you know that's true. Would you be interested in knowing something about the monetary process? The people that actually handle and record the money are myself, Jennie the Office Manager, and our weekend plate counters. Some churches in the past have had problems in this area. Good financial practices ask that safety factors are put in place to insure that the congregation feels confident and safe from both financial shenanigans and genuine mistakes.

The way we insure accuracy and credibility is through a multistep process that double-checks and guarantees accuracy of all people involved in the process. This isn't just for the benefit of the congregation, but also protects the reputation of each of the people involved so no stain of possible wrongdoing can be attached to them. These rules were set up when I started as Financial Manager seventeen years ago and they include:

- All checks filled out for billing are made by one (usually Jennie) and then are double-checked and signed by the other (usually myself or another on the bank account name list). All checks made out for \$1,000 or more always need to be fully signed by both people.
- All contributions made to the church are verified for contributor name and amount before being entered into an Excel spreadsheet and the Shepherd's Staff data base for recording.
- At the end of each month, the General and Restricted Fund bank accounts are reconciled by myself, as opposed to the entering of the account information, which is made by Jennie. Therefore both people are crosschecking all entries for accuracy. If things don't balance perfectly, even by one penny, the cause is found and corrected.
- I keep up-to-date spreadsheets of all restricted funds and other accounts that I compare with the bank register to correct any possible typos.
- All ACH donations processed through the State Bank are handled according to strict federal guidelines and both Jennie and myself verify each step personally. Our online donations are also handled according to strict regulations and are thoroughly documented.
- I maintain spreadsheets and graphs each week that track how spending compares with our various budget accounts and how our contributions are comparing with our needs.

Each of the above steps are done continuously to verify the accuracy of all income and expenses. The staff takes these operations very seriously because we know this is God's money we're dealing with.

In addition, every six months, we have an internal audit done by independent congregational members who were former bank employees, checking for anything out of the ordinary. All in all, I think we have a very safe and controlled process that we can all be confident in.

Some of you may find this information boring and unnecessary. But all the staff knows they are stewards of God's money and property and consider it very important. Please contact me with any questions or suggestions.
