AS WE GATHER

Life is not always easy. Life in and of faith is often less easy. In our readings today we encounter a few people who faced difficulty and challenges amid their godly callings. Ezekiel would be sent to speak the Word of God to a rebellious people who wouldn't happily receive the message. The apostle Paul would face his own personal struggles with his "thorn . . . in the flesh" (2 Corinthians 12:7) as he brought the Gospel to many on his mission journeys. Jesus Himself would not be welcomed as Savior when He returned to His hometown of Nazareth. Though things were far from easy, God would bless the work that He called His people and His own Son to do. Even in our times of difficulty and challenges living as His people, we are reminded of the same truth from the Lord: "My grace is sufficient for you, for My power is made perfect in weakness" (2 Corinthians 12:9).

CONFESSION AND ABSOLUTION

Psalm 123; 124:8; 32:5; 123:4; Ezekiel 2:5; 2 Corinthians 12:9; Mark 6:12

Pastor: Echoing the words of the psalmist, we lift our eyes to You, O Lord,

enthroned in the heavens. As we do, we seek Your mercy. Our help is in

the name of the LORD,

People: who made heaven and earth.

Pastor: I said, "I will confess my transgressions to the LORD,"

People: and You forgave the iniquity of my sin.

Pastor: Almighty God, our maker and redeemer, we poor sinners confess unto You

that we are by nature sinful and unclean and that we have sinned against You in thought, word, and deed. Though we lift up our eyes to You, our souls have had more than enough of the scorn of those who are at ease, of

the contempt of the proud.

People: As You claim us as Your own in Baptism through water and the Word,

we struggle to live as Your children. As You call us in faith to trust in You, we face the contempt of others in the world around us. As You collect Your people together as Your church, we often fail to prioritize the work of Your kingdom and the mission You have set before us for the sake of others. We flee for refuge to Your infinite mercy seeking

and imploring Your grace for the sake of our Lord, Jesus Christ.

Pastor: The Lord calls His people and sends them to proclaim His Word, even amid

the scorn and contempt of the world. He sent Ezekiel, along with a promise:

People: "Whether they hear or refuse to hear, . . . they will know that a prophet

has been among them."

Pastor: He sent the apostle Paul, along with a promise:

People: "My grace is sufficient for you, for My power is made perfect in

weakness."

Pastor: He sent His own Son into the world, into our flesh, on our behalf. Though

stricken, smitten, afflicted, and even rejected in His own hometown, the message of the Word made flesh continued to be proclaimed by the

disciples:

People: "So they went out and proclaimed that people should repent."

Pastor: Gathered together as His church, be affirmed and assured that almighty

God, our heavenly Father, has had mercy upon us and has given His only Son to die for us and for His sake forgives us all our sins. To those who believe on His name He gives the power to become the children of God and has promised them His Holy Spirit. All of your sins are forgiven in the name of the Father and of the \maltese Son and of the Holy Spirit. He that believes and is baptized shall be saved. Grant this, Lord, to us all.

People: Amen.

OLD TESTAMENT READING Ezekiel 2:1–5 (Ezekiel's call)

¹He said to me, "Son of man, stand on your feet, and I will speak with you."
²And as he spoke to me, the Spirit entered into me and set me on my feet, and I heard him speaking to me. ³And he said to me, "Son of man, I send you to the people of Israel, to nations of rebels, who have rebelled against me.

They and their fathers have

transgressed against me to this very

day. ⁴The descendants also are impudent and stubborn: I send you to them, and you shall say to them, 'Thus says the Lord God.' ⁵And whether they hear or refuse to hear (for they are a rebellious house) they will know that a prophet has been among them."

Lector: This is the Word of the Lord.

People: Thanks be to God.

EPISTLE 2 Corinthians 12:1–10 (Paul's vision and his thorn)

¹I must go on boasting. Though there is nothing to be gained by it, I will go on to visions and revelations of the Lord. ²I know a man in Christ who fourteen years ago was caught up to the third heaven—whether in the body or out of the body I do not know, God knows. ³And I know that this man was caught up into paradise—whether in the body or out of the body I do not know, God knows— ⁴and he heard things that cannot be told, which man may not utter. ⁵On behalf of this man I will boast, but on my own behalf I will not boast, except of my weaknesses. ⁶Though if I

should wish to boast, I would not be a fool, for I would be speaking the truth. But I refrain from it, so that no one may think more of me than he sees in me or hears from me. ⁷So to keep me from being too elated by the surpassing greatness of the revelations, a thorn was given me in the flesh, a messenger of Satan to harass me, to keep me from being too elated. ⁸Three times I pleaded with the Lord about this, that it should leave me. ⁹But he said to me, "My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness."

Therefore I will boast all the more gladly of my weaknesses, so that the power of Christ may rest upon me. ¹⁰For the sake of Christ, then, I am content with weaknesses, insults, hardships, persecutions, and calamities. For when I am weak, then I am strong.

People: Thanks be to God.

¹[Jesus] went away from there and came to his hometown, and his disciples followed him. ²And on the Sabbath he began to teach in the synagogue, and many who heard him were astonished, saying, "Where did this man get these things? What is the wisdom given to him? How are such mighty works done by his hands? ³Is not this the carpenter, the son of Mary and brother of James and Joses and Judas and Simon? And are not his sisters here with us?" And they took offense at him. ⁴And Jesus said to them, "A prophet is not without honor, except in his hometown and among his relatives and in his own household." ⁵And he could do no mighty work there, except that he laid his hands on a few sick people and healed them. ⁶And he marveled because of their unbelief.

And he went about among the villages teaching.

CATECHISM The Third Article and Explanation: Questions 212–215

People: I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Christian Church, the communion

of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and

the life everlasting. Amen.

Pastor: What does this mean?

I believe that I cannot by my own reason or strength believe in Jesus Christ, my Lord, or come to Him; but the Holy Spirit has called me by the Gospel, enlightened me with His gifts, sanctified and kept me in the true faith.

In the same way He calls, gathers, enlightens, and sanctifies the whole Christian Church on earth, and keeps it with Jesus Christ in the one true faith.

In this Christian Church He daily and richly forgives all my sins and the sins of all believers.

On the Last Day He will raise me and all the dead, and give eternal life to me and all believers in Christ.

This is most certainly true.

Pastor: What are the identifying characteristics of the Church?

People: The identifying marks that guarantee the presence of the Church are

the pure proclamation of the Gospel and the right administration of the Sacraments. Where these are, the Spirit creates faith. God's Word

of promise is sure and does what it says.

Pastor: What are some other outward indications that the Church is present?

People: Such things as gatherings for prayer and worship, the fruits of faith,

and suffering for Christ also serve as good outward indications that the Church is present without guaranteeing it. The Church also uses the Office of the Keys to rebuke and to forgive sins, as well as to

consecrate ministers to preach and teach on behalf of all.

Pastor: What is the mission of the Church on earth?

People: The Church's mission is to confess and proclaim the forgiveness of

sins for Jesus' sake by preaching the Word, administering the

Sacraments, sending missionaries, and establishing new

congregations and by the daily witness of the baptized children of

God, His royal priesthood.

Pastor: What are some of the privileges and responsibilities of members of the

Church?

People: We should regularly receive the Word and Sacraments within the

community of believers.

Pastor: We should belong to congregations that confess and teach the pure Word

of God.

People: We should beware of and avoid false teachings, false teachers, and

organizations that promote false teaching.

Pastor: We should tell others about Jesus, participate in works of mercy and

service, and support the ministry of the church with prayer and financial

gifts.

Pastor: Let us pray for the people of God in Christ Jesus, for His church, and for all

people according to their needs. God of continued mercy, Your power is made perfect in weakness and Your grace is sufficient for us. perfect in weakness. Lord, in Your mercy,

People: hear our prayer.
