Many people will watch the weather to decide if it is worth going outdoors. Others will watch the weather to make sure they are adequately dressed to enjoy the outdoors. Each person who lives here cherishes the winter months for what they bring to life, or they focus on the added burdens winter makes them endure.

The only time I could sit in the house growing up was if we were in a blizzard. Otherwise, my mom would send us out to the city park to go skating, sliding, fort building, or having a snowball fight to burn off energy. We didn't have a snowblower, so anytime it snowed we cleared the driveway as a family while dad cleared the heavy stuff from the plow. I have great memories, as I hope you do.

In high school I joined the cross-country ski team. Sure, I remember those cold practice days skiing with the team endlessly around the football practice field until dark. ### FROM YOUR LLB CHAIR...





he Grandparenting meeting for January was canceled due to the cold. Our next meeting will be on February 17 at 7:00 p.m. in the music room.








As we look forward to the spring activities, it is only a matter of time until we blink and the summer vacation will be here.

- Colored felt
- Scrap paper
- Permanent marker
- Scissors
- String
- Essential oils (rose, lavender, etc.)

### What you do:

- 1. Draw a flower shape on paper and cut it out.
- 2. Place the flower template on felt and draw around it with the marker.
- 3. Cut out the felt flower. Then cut a small slit or hole through it.
- 4. Cut 8 inches of string. Thread it through the felt flower and tie to form a loop for hanging.
- 5. To the felt, add 3 to 5 drops of essential oil. This air freshener will last about 2 weeks.
- 6. Revive the scent, as needed, by adding a few drops of essential oil.







#### Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

he prophet Isaiah writes: "But now thus says the Lord, He who created you, O Jacob, He who formed you, O Israel: 'Fear not, for I have redeemed you; I have called you by name, you are mine. When you pass through the waters, I will be with you; and through the rivers, they shall not overwhelm you; when you walk through fire you shall not be burned, and the flame shall not consume you. For I am the Lord your God, the Holy One of Israel, your Savior" (Isaiah 43:1-3a).

Even in the midst of disaster, the Lord remains with His people.

The wildfires in Los Angeles County, California, continue to inflict widespread damage and suffering throughout the Los Angeles area. The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod (LCMS) is in close communication with the LCMS Pacific Southwest District (PSD) regarding our Synod's response. I am in regular contact with PSD President Rev. Mike Gibson. LCMS Disaster Response Director Rev. Dr. Ross Johnson has

been on the ground in Los Angeles, and the PSD and the congregations there are providing aid for critical needs. Many LCMS people have lost their homes, including longtime elderly residents.

As long as it takes, LCMS Disaster Response will walk alongside the PSD and its congregations in this response. Our shared response includes the entire Synod's prayers, along with spiritual resources to assist church workers as they care for their congregations. In addition, we are here to offer practical support in the form of ongoing counsel and advice and material support in the form of supplies, recovery grants and volunteer coordination.

Trinity Lutheran Church Lay Leadership Board Minutes 6:30 PM, Tuesday January 14, 2025

Attendance: Pastor Gueldner, Mitch, Barb, Deb, Penny, Carl and Dan. Brian was absent.

Opening prayer led by Pastor Gueldner.

#### Faribault Lutheran School Report:

Enrollment for 2024-25 school year is at 140. National Lutheran Schools Week will be January 26-31<sup>st</sup>. The students will sing at the joint worship service at Trinity at 10:30 on Sunday, January 26. Also that day at 9:30 there will be special activities to honor our first Responders. Tuesday, January 28<sup>th</sup> from 4-8 pm there will be a fundraiser at Basillios. The annual souper bowl will be held on Friday, January 31<sup>st</sup>.

#### FOC report:

December contributions were great. We ended the year with a general fund balance of \$112,000. There has been some interest in the Finance Manager position. We need to get an application and resume from each person and then we will begin to interview. Deb, Penny, and Carl will be involved in the process. There will be a retirement party for Bill, held between services. Date to be determined when his position is filled.

### Sudanese Ministry/Rev Reat

Attendance is increasing. The Christmas service attendance was 350 people. Still no financial support from the Sudanese congregations.

#### Pastor report:

Pastor reported that he has been talking with a couple of men in our congregation who are interested in the ministry.

#### Consolidation Discussion Update:

### From Your Finance Manager...


### FINAL 2024 FINANCIAL NUMBERS

or those of you who did not see the financial figures in the last *Trinity Weekly* a week ago Sunday, here is how we came out for the year. Even though we didn't come out in the black for the year, I was pleasantly surprised by how well we did come out in the end.

As a separate issue, I have been hearing that the financial graphs I've been printing each month have been confusing for some. I want all financial information to be crystal clear for all, so I'm going to change the graph slightly to hopefully make it more clear. The confusion, I think, lies in the direction of the bold black deficit line. The change is minor, but the old way might have seemed weird to some. The deficit is now shown as going up as the deficit increases, plus the numbers on the right side are positive, not negative, as before. So the higher the bold line, the worse the deficit is and the numbers on the right show a worse deficit as they go more positive. Please let me know if this helps

make things more clear. If it doesn't help, I'll find other ways to clarify the information.

I was worried during most of the year by how our deficit was growing steeply through most of the year. At the rate we were going, I thought we could wind up with an \$80k to \$100k deficit which could have depleted our entire General Fund balance and left us broke by the end of the year. Things looked the worst around October. But then in the final two months, due to a large individual donation plus excellent December contributions from the whole congregation, our deficit was reduced by \$40k, which was a decrease of 66%, a huge amount.



A large amount of that turnaround is almost certainly due to Pastor Gueldner's stewardship messages during the fall months. He made us realize how important it is to return to God what we can to thank Him for all the good things He does for us each and every day.

Then to add to that good news, our total expenses for the year were lower than expected by 10%. The 10% savings were largely from an easy 2024 winter, saving us gas costs and snow plowing expenses and Pr. Gueldner having an eleven month year beginning in February, saving a month in salary/benefits. Those savings in expense covered the \$20k deficit we had left, leaving us in good shape at year's end. I believe the lower expenses, especially the easier winter, is an example of God being with us and watching over us during the year.

Now we are beginning a new year and our 2025 contributions are just as import as this last year. Please continue with your good stewardship beginning in January of this new year. I was worried last year that concerns over the possible consolidation was having an effect on our stewardship, but now it appears that was not the case; we found that God will always be with us no matter what His ultimate plan for us may be.
