any of the great leaders of the faith in the Bible sought God and His ways differently than you and I today. What was their model despite the many challenges they faced in their life? During the Exodus of the people of Israel from Egypt, Moses could have asked God to give him wisdom to deal with the many administrative tasks on his plate. Listen and learn from Moses.

This was his request. "If you are pleased with me, teach me your ways so that I know you and continue to find favor with you" (Exodus 33:13).

When you think about it, what kind of requests do you make to God? I'm in a tough spot today, I want You to fix it for me. Our request is 180 degrees from the request of Moses who sought friendship with God and understanding.

Please join the Trinity Elders and me as we venture during this Lenten season through a series exploring the "Hand of the Lord." We begin the series on Ash Wednesday and conclude the last service of the series on Easter Sunday.

Let us be like Moses, wanting to know the heart of God. "Teach me your ways that I may know you. Remember that this nation is your people" (Exodus 33:13). King David describes this in fuller detail in Psalm 103:7 "To know him" includes all the other things Moses could ever seek, including the solution to his problem. And God gave him what he asked, "He made known his ways unto Moses."

MARCH PASTOR'S CORNER...

How often are we only concerned with our problems and not the larger picture?

Let us be like Moses. His prayers are bigger than himself. "If your presence doesn't go with us, do not send us from here" (Exodus 33:15).

Notice the "us" in his prayer, which speaks about the whole people of Israel. Are your prayers larger than yourself thinking about your town, nation, or the world? Check out the topics we will explore about the Hand of God on Wednesday evenings during Lenten services at 5:30 p.m. and throughout Holy Week. You will be blessed.






This month, we have a couple of opportunities for families and congregation members to interact with what happens at the school from a day-to-day standpoint.

This snack's layers mimic properties of our planet's crust.

What you need:

- 1 cup rolled oats
- ½ cup nut butter (divided)
- ½ cup chocolate chips
- Microwave-safe bowl
- Silicone mini baking cups

What you do:

- 1. Combine the oats and ½ cup of the nut butter. Mix until oats stick together.
- 2. Place 2 teaspoons of oat mixture in each baking cup. Press with a spoon. Freeze for 10 minutes.
- 3. Spread remaining nut butter atop the cups. Freeze for 10 more minutes.
- 4. Microwave the chocolate chips 30 seconds. Stir and keep heating for 30-second intervals until melted.
- 5. Spread melted chocolate atop the cups. Freeze until chocolate is firm.
- Remove from the molds and enjoy! Refrigerate leftovers in an airtight container.

Faribault Lutheran School Report:

Enrollment for 2024-25 school year is at 140. Registration for the 25-26 school year will be held on February 11. The cost of tuition will be \$4100 for non-members/\$3700 for members of either Peace or Trinity. FLS will host an open house on February 11 for anyone interested in touring the school and more information about the upcoming year. A glow dance will be held on February 21st for FLS students and on February 28 for Peace Preschool in the FLS gym.

FOC report:

January attendance and contributions were low due to a very cold third weekend. Our general fund balance is still healthy at this time.

Sudanese Ministry/Rev Reat

Attendance is steady. The New Year's service attendance was 160.

Consolidation Discussion Update:
