Update on the Consolidation

A Congregational Mtg. for Trinity members to discuss the consolidation of Peace/Trinity/FLS/Peace Preschool will be held at 6:30 p.m. on May 5. There will be no voting at this meeting.

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION

The LCMS Minnesota South District recently released an article regarding the Walz Administration's proposed budget. If enacted, this budget would have a significant impact, not only on Faribault Lutheran School (FLS), but on all private schools across the state of Minnesota. The proposed budget affects two key areas of our students' day-to-day experience:

1. Nonpublic Aid Funding

This funding is essential for two main reasons:

Curriculum Reimbursement: FLS currently receives reimbursement for curriculum expenses throughout the year. This funding supports our non religious curriculum, including English/Language Arts, Science, Social Studies, and Math. While FLS retains the right to select curricula that align with our beliefs, we are still eligible for public funding to support these educational materials.

Health Services: Nonpublic aid also helps fund essential health-related items such as basic first-aid supplies (e.g., Band-Aids, ice packs). Additionally, it allows us to hire a nurse, through the public school system, to handle necessary paperwork and conduct vision and hearing screenings.

2. Transportation

Under the proposed budget, nonpublic schools would lose access to transportation provided by public schools. This would shift the responsibility of getting students to and from school entirely to families, creating significant challenges for many, especially those who rely on busing.
