

FROM YOUR LLB CHAIR...

lmost 18 months ago, the Trinity and Peace congregations voted to pursue consolidating the two churches into one new church. The question was if one entity could better serve God in Faribault than separate entities. Both congregations overwhelmingly approved of the resolution.



Since that vote, a committee has been working on a proposal to consolidate the congregations. They held four informational meetings this spring, presenting what the new church could look like after the consolidation.

There will be announcements for three upcoming meetings. There will be a Trinity meeting, a joint informational/prayer service, and a Trinity voters' meeting in the next few weeks. These meetings will be an opportunity for discussion. I will be conducting the Trinity-only meeting.

Article II of our constitution states our purpose is that of a Christian organization providing for worship, religious instruction and to carryout Christ's mission for His church. The question we are to prayerfully consider is, are we meeting our purpose as a church by consolidating with Peace Lutheran or remaining separate congregations? Whichever direction God leads us, we will continue to work together to serve His church.



- 4 oz. cream cheese, softened
- 1 cup heavy cream
- 3 Tablespoons powdered sugar
- 1 teaspoon lemon juice
- 6-10 strawberries, washed and sliced
- 6 slices of white bread
- Cellophane







Opening prayer led by Pastor Gueldner.

Faribault Lutheran School Report:

Registration for 2025-26 school year is currently at 144 with 11 pending. The Gala was held on April 5th. Students sang at Peace on the 6th. Kindergarten play will be April 29th. Chrysteena reported that if the school kitchen is used a school staff member must be present. The property board will be directed to decide on a fee to help cover the staff's pay.

FOC report:

March income and expenses were about even. The first quarter expenditures were about \$8,000 less than budget. Noel will be re-creating some charting to make income, expenses, and attendance easier to read. He will not be doing a letter for the Newsletter each month but will update financials.

Sudanese Ministry/Rev Reat

Pastor Reat has nothing new to report since returning from his trip.

Property Manager:

Dustin obtained a maintenance agreement with Faribo Air. Carl moved to approve, Brian seconded. motion carried. The rooftop units will be replaced upon obtaining permits from the city. The job description for Property Manager is being reviewed.

Consolidation Discussion Update:

There has been a written request signed by 10 members of the congregation to have a meeting with Trinity members only to discuss the consolidation. That meeting has been set for May 5 at 6:30.
