ow do we respond to the poor around us? In a recent radio broadcast, Dr. James Dobson approached this subject. Our scripture reading recently in

this subject. Our scripture reading recently in worship dealt with the parable of the Samaritan.

A man was found alongside a road beaten, stripped and robbed of his earthly treasure. Two religious leaders from the Temple in Jerusalem couldn't be bothered to attend to this man's needs. A Samaritan man saw the injured man and came to his rescue. What made this man different than the last two? He had compassion.

The Samaritan man looked past the ragged and torn clothes. He was even willing to touch the man to tend to his wounds. The other two men couldn't be bothered in their pride to do anything. They strutted by looking to see if anyone noticed their hypocrisy as church leaders.

The world is full of once famous people who end up on the streets. Dr. Dobson told the story about Stephen C. Foster, a famous composer in the 19th century. He wrote over two hundred songs that today you still may recognize—"Swanie River," "O Susanna" and "My Old Kentucky Home" to name a few. This once famous man fell on hard times and into financial ruin.

Are there people in our community who fall into that same category? Many of the homeless were once great people in town. Many suffer physical and mental health issues. Who has compassion on them now? Social services might help for a time, but they are stuck and can't get out.

Jesus had compassion on you before you were ever born. He knew about your sin and was willing to take on your punishment. He doesn't pick and choose as society does, but

looks into the eyes of a sinner and says I can help you.

You and I listen to a radio broadcast from time to time. Once in a while we hear about a special day designated Donut Day, Mac and Cheese Day, Chocolate Day, Ice Cream Day and a host of others. During the month of May the United States celebrated Mental Health month. During July it is Minority Mental Health Month.



My question to you today. When you pass by a homeless person do you see another person created in the image of God or do you only focus on their outward appearance? Many of us would rather walk by the homeless and not get involved as the Pharisee and Levite did. In our day that would be a Pastor, Elder, or Important church leader and Christian member.

What does a homeless person need? They need love, understanding, and compassion that stems from a heart blessed by Jesus. But, what about those who have homes? 30% of Americans have felt loneliness once a week in the last year. 30% of 18 – 34-year-olds report being lonely every day. Single adults report being lonely 39% of the time compared to 22% reported for a married couple. Technology might aid social interactions, but research from adults found meaningful face to face

encounters versus online interactions that may seem more superficial were split, 54 vs. 46.

What's the bottom line; God created us as social creatures. We are intended to live and work in a community and family structure. Anyone outside of that model can become lonely.

Be that person who invests in others. Just because someone looks on the outside to be successful, they may be lonely from a death in the family, job transfer, or change in their home life. Look at people with the eyes of Jesus. It will make a difference in their life and yours.

This easy and colorful craft helps kids remember that Jesus is their light no matter where they go!


What you need:

Faribault Lutheran School Report:

Registration for 2025-26 school year is currently at 144 with 8 pending. Mrs. Saehler will be visiting student family's farms to learn more about farming after she returns from the youth convention. She will be out of the office from July 15 to July 28. FLS is looking to hire a middle school ELA teacher to replace Sarah Meyer. There will be a two day camp for students enrolled in the 25-26 school year on August 11 and 12. There is a 25 student capacity with a cost of \$50 per student.

FOC report:

June expenses exceeded income by \$8,536.71. We are short of our 2025 expenses to date by \$29,144.00. Property insurance only increased by 10% due to switching companies.

Pastor Reat report:

The attendance for June saw an increase. Pastor Reat needs to start moving his office from the school side of the building into the associate pastor office by the time school starts. He will need help cleaning both offices for that to happen.

Property Manager:

Still waiting for a committee to form to research floor replacement in the sanctuary.

Pastor Guelder Report:

Pastor agreed to stay at Trinity for three more months to help prepare us for our next pastor as well as continue with the other duties in his contract.

Call Committee:

There has been a call committee formed with 3 LLB members, 2 Elders as well as members at large.

Future Discussion:

The Elders joined us for further discussion on how we can move forward since we will not consolidate with Peace. Rally Sunday was discussed and a committee was formed to organize it. The committee will consist of Barb, Curt, Brian, Sharon and Nancy.

The Time and Talent sheet is being prepared and will be handed out on Rally Sunday.

FIXER-UPPERS



ummer is peak time for home renovations and remodeling projects. Those can be super stressful, starting with the selection of a contractor.

In a blog about her own family's construction plans, Laura Elliott explains the challenge: "It's not just any builder I want. I want one who has impeccable workmanship, is completely trustworthy and delivers our long-awaited [projects] early and under-budget." After sifting through bids and reviews, she discovered that most builders "look like they do pretty similar work for a pretty similar price."

For spiritual renovations, however, the choice is clear. "God is the builder of everything," says Hebrews 3:4 (NIV). Elliott writes, "Jesus is not only the *builder* of His Father's house, but He is the *buyer*, and the *heir* as well." And what He's building, she adds, is "a better Bride," His church.

Faith upgrades are an ongoing, lifelong process. "The renewal of our natures is a work of great importance," said 18th-century minister George Whitefield. "It is not to be done in a day. We have not only a new house to build up, but an old one to pull down." It's a good thing God oversees this project!
