

Turn old Christmas cards into beautiful keepsake ornaments! It's a fun, simple way to give new life to cards you've received and add a handmade touch to your tree.


What you need:

UPDATE ON NEW CARPET FOR THE SANCTUARY

Needed ,

committee was formed this fall to consider the need for replacing the carpet in the sanctuary. The existing carpet was installed 35 years ago when the church was built. It has served us well; however, we see places where the carpet is wearing thin, and is stained and faded.

After looking at flooring options, we concluded commercial carpet tile was the answer. The pattern selected will give visual interest while complimenting the stone, brick, wood-tone of the altar and pews, as well as the upholstered seats.

The cost for materials and installation will be approximately \$57,000. We are extremely grateful to the Trinity Pie Makers for gifting \$50,000 to the project. For the remaining balance, monetary gifts will be appreciated. Please earmark your donation "carpet replacement".

As for a time frame, we are looking at installation to begin the first week in January. This will take approximately three weeks to complete. There will be some disruption in our "normal" operation during this project. We will be asking for your help as we need volunteers to assist in moving pews, tearing out old carpet, prepping the floor and cleaning his will be an incredible opportunity to share our in-

Faribault Lutheran School Report:

The 7th and 8th graders will be performing "Fast Food" Thursday, November 20 at 6:00 pm. The Thanksgiving break will be Nov 26-28. The office will be open Nov 26 from 9-2 and closed 27-28.

Mitch received a notification from the FLS board of a planned meeting on Sunday, November 23 at 10:15 at Peace concerning a change in the FLS by-laws. Carl made a motion and Deb second it to not bring it forth concerned about the time being during our late service. Motion carried. Maybe it could be held at a better time that would work for both congregations. Mitch will inform Sara H.

FOC report:

October expenses exceeded income by \$10,752.43 leaving our deficit at over \$83,000. The general fund balance is down to just over \$32,000. There is a \$7,000.00 balance yet to be paid for the church sanctuary carpet. Motion made by Barb and 2^{nd} by Deb to do 50/50 on new family leave payments. Motion carried. Budget approved.

Family Ministry:

A choir directed by Rebecca F. would like to give a free will offering concert at Trinity on Friday March 27, 2026. They requested Trinity to supply a meal for the 44 students and 9 adults. We agreed to host it with congregational help.

Pastor Report:

Services are covered for December except for Christmas Eve and Christmas Day. We will continue to reach out to area Pastors to cover those three services.

Executive Session:

Mitch thanked Deb M. and Brad T. for their years of service.


