

A Word: The Transfiguration is a revelation of Christ’s divine nature before he begins his journey toward the cross. Jesus takes three disciples with him as witnesses, Peter, James, and John. Moses and Elijah appear. From Luke, we know that they discuss Jesus’ crucifixion, resurrection, and ascension. The entirety of God’s promises are about to be fulfilled in Christ, true God and true Man, who will die as a ransom for many. Peter remembers the Transfiguration in our epistle reading. He was an eyewitness of Christ’s majesty. But the Transfiguration was momentary. Peter points us to an enduring witness that has been confirmed beyond doubt, the writings of the prophets. The Word of God is always faith’s sure foundation.

The Old Testament reading is a bit odd. But we should notice that the elders of Israel feasted in God’s presence only after they had been cleansed with blood. Jesus cleanses us with his blood, and we too feast with God as friends when we celebrate the Sacrament, the foretaste of the feast to come. – Pastor Alex

Trinity History: In preparation for ministry at Trinity, I have been reading the history of the congregation in the book *Diamond Anniversary of Trinity Lutheran Church*. This was published for the 75th anniversary of Trinity. I'd like to highlight just a few things over the next few weeks that stand out to me about the history of Trinity. The first is the humble origins of Trinity. Trinity's history begins when a congregation, Emmanuel, was established in 1863 in section 31 of the Wheeling Township by 8 voting members. Pastor Christian Krause was called to serve this church in 1867. Meeting with significant resistance from another church in the area and "the opposition of lodges" (pg. 8), Pastor Krause turned his attention to Faribault, where he founded Trinity Lutheran Church on January 1, 1870. There were 23 men who signed the constitution. Pastor Krause was forced to resign shortly that same year. He was eventually bedridden and died on October 9, 1873, at only 31 years of age.

Pastor Krause died younger than I am today. Christ says that a man's fruit may multiply a hundredfold. But in only 31 years of life, Pastor Krause's work has multiplied to thousands of men, women, and children because he left behind a congregation that has outlived him by 156 years.

Jesus said to his disciples in John 4:38, "I sent you to reap that for which you did not labor. Others have labored, and you have entered into their labor." I am blessed to be entering into the labor of great men and women that Christ has sent before me to Trinity. May God bless all of us with a sincere desire to cultivate the labor of the saints who have gone before us, and to plant new seeds of our own that he will use to richly bless those who follow. — Pastor Alex

Here is a tidbit to show the reach of the Radio Club:

We have a listener who was a lifelong member of Immanuel Lutheran Church in North Minneapolis until it closed. He went to Immanuel parochial school (in the 50's), where his 2nd-grade teacher was Jane Velzke (member of Trinity). He actually knew Pastor Gueldner as a young lad back in the 60's. When his mother became invalid and unable to attend church, they discovered our radio broadcast. They listened for almost 10 years until she was called Home. He retired to Belize and continues to worship with us through the live stream. He feels connected and will continue to be with us. This is an amazing showing of how our ministry is spreading across the world. Please continue to pray for the Radio Club.
