

A Word: For the first Sunday in Lent, we recall Jesus’ temptation in the wilderness. The first temptation took place in paradise. Eve had no reason to doubt God’s goodness, but as soon as Satan tempted her, she fell into doubt and into sin. Doubt in God’s goodness is the foundation of all sin. Jesus is tempted in the wilderness. He is hungry. The cross looms before him. Things are not perfect, yet in each temptation, he maintains his trust in his heavenly Father. He is faithful where we prove faithless.

In Romans 5, Paul contrasts the sin of Adam with the righteousness of Christ. Because of Adam, sin entered the world, and because all sin, all die. But Christ brings the righteousness that overcomes sin and gives eternal life to all who believe in him.

A Blast from the Past: Ten years after Trinity was founded by Pastor Krause, Henry Schulz, who was a candidate for ministry from the Iowa Seminary (probably Wartburg Seminary in Dubuque, Iowa) was ordained in 1881. He served for fifty-one years. He is buried in the Maple Lawn Cemetery. During that time, Trinity become a member of the Missouri Synod and began to use English in the worship services. German was the exclusive language for worship as late as 1921. Even at the school, German was the exclusive language for religious instruction until 1925, though English was used for other subjects. He was also president of the Minnesota District from 1908-1912. Pastor Schulz is a witness to how richly God has blessed Trinity, and the loving care he has shown for this congregation in the pastors he has sent. May he bless all of us as he did Pastor Schulz and the congregation of that time.
