FROM OUR SENIOR PASTOR...

Dear Trinity,

Summer is officially here, along with all the blessings it brings. My kids are enjoying T-Ball and Little League, and I'm sure yours have found things to do as well. Hopefully, amidst the hustle and bustle of summer, you also find time to enjoy what God has made, camping, fishing, hiking, and giving thanks to God through all of it.

However, sometimes we get so wrapped up in the gifts of God that we forget the Giver. I remember my parents recording us opening gifts every Christmas to send a copy to my grandparents. This was back in the days of camcorders and film, which meant that shooting second takes was difficult. Before unwrapping gifts, my parents would remind us, "Make sure you say thank you to the person who gave it." And if we didn't say thank you, dad had to rewind the film, find just the right spot, and try again. It's good for parents to remind children that the gift itself is less important than the giver. In fact, the gift has meaning because of who gave it. The object itself could be purchased at Walmart, but when it is given by a specific person, it becomes a sign of love to the one who receives it. That is the real meaning of every gift.

Each day, we are surrounded by the gifts of God. The first gift is existence. There is no law of nature that caused us to exist. But God willed it, so here we are. Every morning is a sign of God's love, despite any pain that may accompany getting out of bed, because we



have received the gift of life for another day. All those activities we enjoy over the summer take place in a world that God created for the purpose of sustaining life. And look how rich that life is! There are thousands of fish in Minnesota lakes, millions of plants that decorate the ground, and space everywhere you look for human endeavor. God created all of this, and he presented it to us as his great gift. What we should see in creation is not an object that sprang into existence as an accident of physics, but a sign of God's love to the ones who receive it, you and me.

So while we enjoy our summer, I would encourage everyone in the parish to remember to give thanks. In your heart certainly, but also in the gathering of believers. There is a gift we receive in the Church that we find nowhere else, the body and blood of Christ. But we also worship as we can nowhere else, offering our praise and thanks to God in the company of saints and angels. Christ says that he is present where two or three are gathered, but why restrict ourselves to two or three? Why not assemble as a hundred, lifting up our thanks and praise with the multitude of believers?

As we go about our summer, I would encourage you to give thanks, and to remember these words from Hebrews 10:24-25, "Let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day drawing near."

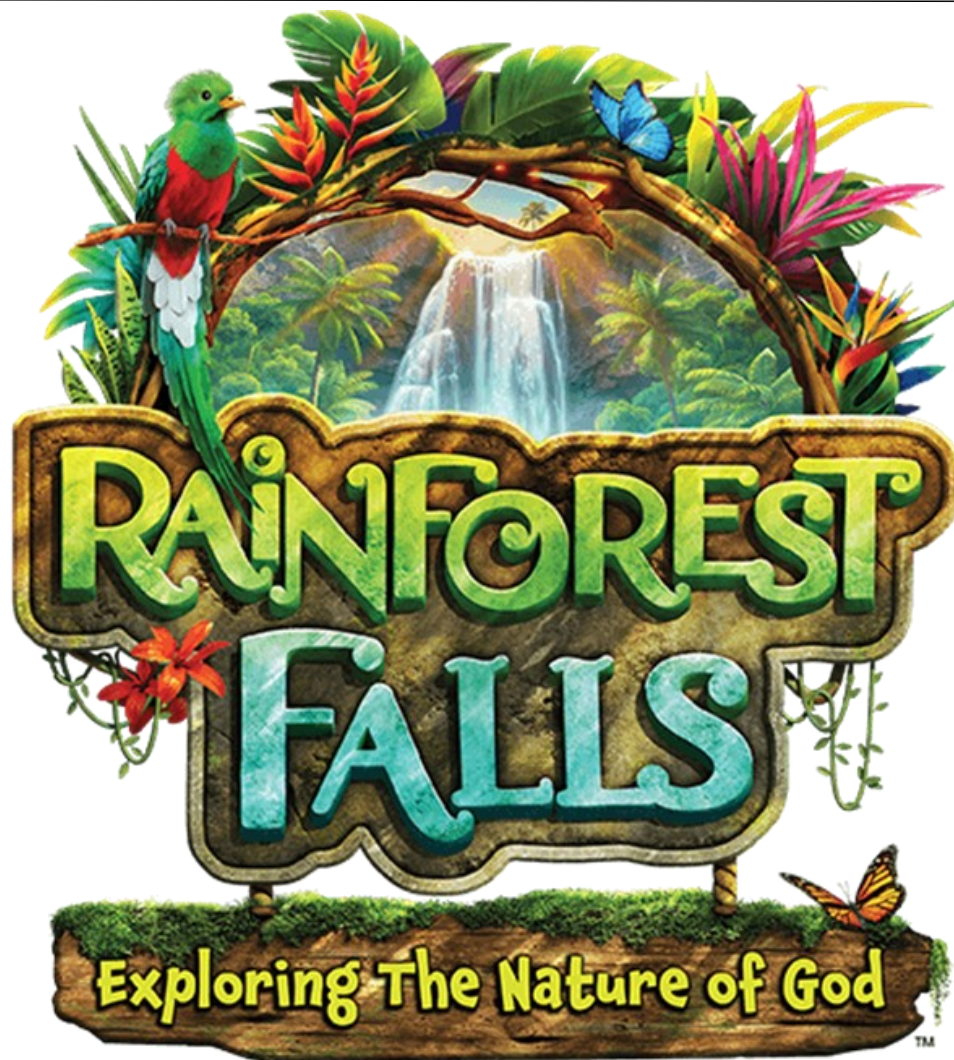

What you need:

- 1 roll refrigerated sugar cookie dough
- Knife
- Baking sheet
- Wooden craft sticks
- Frosting
- Sprinkles
- Clear treat bags
- Ribbon



What you do:

1. Freeze the cookie dough for 15 to 20 minutes to firm it up, then slice into 1/4-inch rounds.
2. Place cookies on a baking sheet about 2 inches apart.
3. Bake at 350 degrees for 5 minutes.
4. Remove from the oven and gently press a wooden stick halfway into the bottom of each cookie.
5. Return to the oven and bake 3 to 5 more minutes, until lightly golden.
6. Let cookies cool completely.
7. Decorate with frosting to create smiling faces and add sprinkles.
8. Slip each cookie pop into a treat bag and tie with ribbon.



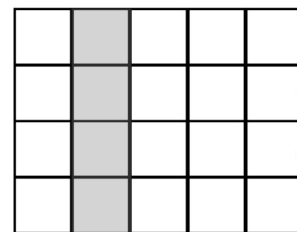
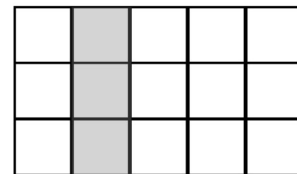
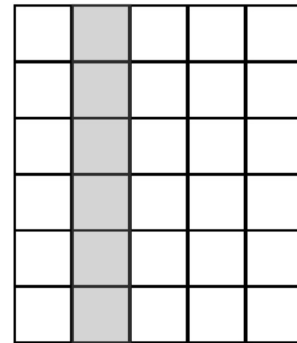

OPPORTUNITIES FOR FUN AND SERVICE THIS SUMMER:

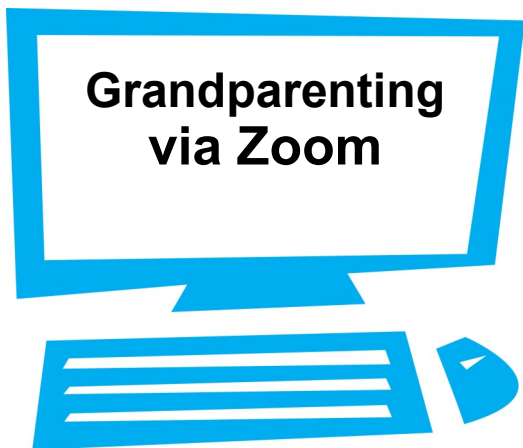

NEWS FROM THE RADIO CLUB

Wow! It's July already! Where has the year gone so far?

The Radio Club has been busy during the first six months of 2026. Our biggest accomplishment has been the redesign and rebuilding of our website (<https://trinityradioandvideo.org>). We have redone the website to make it look more modern and give us the ability to add more functionality quickly and easily.

One of the newest additions to the website is our "Sermons" page. If you go to this page, you will have the ability to listen to just the sermon for a particular service. We started this in April, so you can listen to anything from Holy Week 2026, to the current one. You can also search Spotify for "Trinity Faribault" to find and listen to our sermons.

Also, during the first half of this year, we completed our streaming server configuration and now have a completely redundant setup. If one of our electronic devices fails during the service, we can have a spare in place within minutes, allowing us to continue streaming and displaying service information on the sanctuary screens.

All these initiatives are funded by your gifts, memorials, and sponsorship of our services. We are reaching people all over the world. Our messages are being heard. We are working hard to give Trinity the tools to fulfill the Great Commission given to us by Jesus and recorded in Matthew 28:



¹⁸ Then Jesus came to them and said, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. ¹⁹ Therefore, go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, ²⁰ and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely, I am with you always, to the very end of the age."

We have not had to ask for your help in quite some time. Now that we have built-in full redundancy for our streaming and in-house technology, we must look forward to our next contract with KDHL. That is nearly \$12,000. We also have our streaming contract coming due in July, which is nearly \$3,000. We could use your help. Please consider a gift to the Radio Club to help us through these contracts this year.

Our group has several dedicated people who are making this all happen. Please thank them if you get a chance. Our team consists of: Dustin G., Courtney P., Cameron D., Nick D., Brian A., Josh C., Andy P., Brian F., Michelle F., and Sierra F.

FREEDOM WORTH GUARDING

Because many Americans have never known life without freedom, it can be easy to take our liberties for granted. The Israelites, however, knew the harsh reality of slavery. Yet even after God led them out of Egypt, they struggled to embrace their newfound freedom. Faced with uncertainty, they grew fearful and complained against Moses and Aaron, longing for the familiarity of their former bondage rather than trusting God's provision.

Their story feels surprisingly familiar. As Christians, we have been set free through a far greater deliverance. Our freedom was secured at a great cost through the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. And yet, we sometimes



drift back toward old habits, attitudes and patterns that once held us captive.

Scripture reminds us to stand firm in the freedom we have been given. As Paul writes in Galatians 5:1 (NKJV), "Stand fast therefore in the liberty by which Christ has made us free, and do not be entangled again with a yoke of bondage."

True freedom is not simply the absence of restraint. It is the opportunity to live fully in God's grace, walking in obedience, joy and purpose. This kind of freedom is worth celebrating, protecting and living out every day.

To schedule your photography appointment online, go to www.ucdir.com, click on photography appointment scheduling login on the right side, enter [mn676](#) in the Church Code field and enter [676mem](#) in the Church Password field. Follow the prompts to schedule your family's appointment time. If you have 6 or more in your family please use 2 consecutive time slots. The online scheduling option is available Monday through Friday. Note: online signup will **not** work over the weekend to allow for in-person signup at church. **Appointments fill up quickly, so schedule as soon as possible to secure your preferred date and time.**
