Dear Trinity,

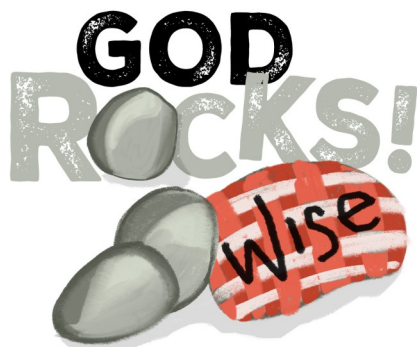

Make decorative stones

What you need:

- Flat, smooth stones
- Printed, decorative napkins
- Paintbrush
- Clear-drying craft glue
- Scissors
- Permanent marker

What you do:

1. Unfold the napkin, carefully separating the printed side from the solid side.
2. Brush a thin layer of glue atop a stone. Lay the napkin (printed side up) on the glue and press down. Paint more glue over the napkin. Let dry.
3. Turn the stone over and paint more glue on the back. Wrap the napkin edges around the stone, trimming as needed. Paint more glue over the napkin. Let dry.
4. On the stone, write an attribute of God (loving, wise, powerful, merciful, etc.).
5. Repeat with more stones. Use them as gifts, paperweights, table decorations, etc.

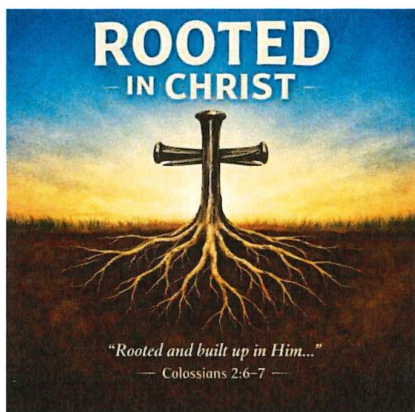

Guest Presentation

Jon Lorton provided a presentation on Investment Management and Gift Planning Services.

Faribault Lutheran School Report

- The school year has started positively.
- Discussion held regarding the future of the School Board and Governance Policy.
- Proposed School Board bylaws were completed and presented to Peace Lutheran Church Council on August 25.

Pastor Alex's Report

- **Financial Report:** Expenses exceeded income by **\$7,298.99**.
- **Attendance Report:** Attendance continues to grow and is currently above levels from five years ago.
- **Sudanese Ministry:** Attendance remains steady, with strong participation during the second week at Trinity.
- Ministry teams and Bible study groups met on August 26 to discuss the governance structure.
- Fourteen students will begin Confirmation on September 16 with ten mentors. Requirements include Scripture memorization, twice-monthly Sunday School/church attendance, and acolyte service.
- The proposed School Board bylaws have been completed.
- A suggested church goal for 2027 is continued work toward a united church.
- **2027 Theme:** *One in Christ*.

Executive Session

- Motion to exit: Nura; seconded by Dale.

Property Board Report

- Parking lot project will be funded entirely through the Temporary Holding Fund.
- Rent for the 414 house increased by \$200 beginning in September.

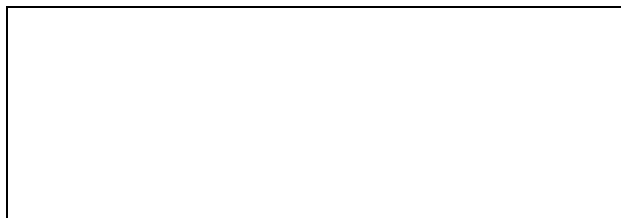
